Chapter note for Haggai 1

*1 Haggai reproveth the people for neglecting the building of the house. 7 He inciteth them to the building.
12 He promiseth God's assistance to them being forward.*

Hag 1:1

Ezr. 5:1. Haggai = Lord's sacrifice; Lord's festival.

Dan. 9:1-2. Possibly another Darius who reigned 36 years, starting about 30 (40?) years after Cyrus.

Hag 1:4

-- CEILED

Ceiled is spelled *cieled* in the Cambridge Bible. This points to heaven (*ciel*) and is more readily understood by foreign-speaking peoples.

Hag 1:9

Like people who neglect the need of their brothers (church) for their own comfort and luxury. Also, those who neglect spiritual needs for physical.

Chapter note for Haggai 2

1 He encourageth the people to the work, by promise of greater glory to the second temple than was in the first. 10 In the type of holy things and unclean he sheweth their sins hindered the work. 20 God's promise to Zerubbabel.

Hag 2:3

Ezr. 3:12.

Hag 2:7

The constellation Coma is anciently that of a virgin holding a child on her lap. The child has a Hebrew name Ihesu, according to the Arab astronomer Albumazer (non-Christian). The Dendera, dating from circa A.D. 400, shows a woman with child on her lap. Coma stems from the Hebrew word, here translated as "desire of."

The antichrist will try to bring peace on earth through his counterfeit of all nations living peaceably together through mutual respect and tolerance. That man is the god of this world. Here the true desire of nations is the Lord Jesus Christ. (Psa. 2:7; 76:3.)

Hag 2:9

"Place" is Jerusalem (Psa. 76:3).
